Calyx Content Ideas for Classrooms – A Sneak Peek

Embarking on a voyage to the new horizons, Calyx is a force to reckon with. It steers forth the path for the educators with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and National Curriculum Framework (NCF). In the budding years of life, when a child learns to explore and experience the world around, Calyx comes as a great booster to mould the personality of the young learners at the Foundational Stage. This is the stage when school starts and the child needs play-based learning coupled with structured activities that are guided by the teacher.

The Foundational Stage bridges the gap between home and school environment of the child and is based on the principles of Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE). It is divided into domains closely linked to the developmental domains of Physical Development, Socio-emotional-ethical Development, Cognitive Development, Language and Literacy Development, Aesthetic and Cultural Development and the most significant domain of Positive Learning Habits. Curricular Goals are defined for the different domains of development in the curriculum designed for the Foundational Stage. At this stage of learning, the pedagogical approach is play-based with the focus on guided and structured activities. The activities should be conducted in spacious venues, such as school garden, yoga room and so on.

The teacher's guide is replete with activities designed to suit the learning experience of the students so that they can engage naturally in the exploration of their surroundings. The activities have instructions for the entire class, balanced with work-time for children, where they work on their own with a variety of materials. Teacher-student relationship is of utmost importance and needs the teacher to be engaged with all the domains instead of just being a domain-specific teacher. It is imperative that individual attention and assessment through observation is carried out for the students at this stage.

The main features of the teacher's guide are:

- Yearly Scheme of Work with a micro schedule with the suggested allocation of periods bringing clarity for the teacher to conduct the lessons efficiently.
- Micro Lesson Plans (MLPs) have multiple periods of 40 minutes duration each, with curricular goals, competencies, learning objectives and learning outcomes, tailored to suit the students' needs for all-round development.
- Teacher-directed, teacher-guided and/or student-led activities to achieve the desired goals.
- Teaching Aids with materials are easily available to aid concept teaching.
- Digital Assets for quick reference by the teacher.
- Methodology includes steps to introduce the concept in the form of an interactive script and doable activity-based teaching methods.

Each activity is marked with

- **MUST DO** to help the student understand the concept.
- **SHOULD DO** to help the student extend and apply the concept.
- **COULD DO** to help the student revise the concept.
- Estimated time for each activity is given for better time management by the teacher.
- Additional Suggested Activities are provided for the reinforcement of the concept taught.
- Content and material to be used, duration and sequence of activities, classroom arrangement – seating, displays, arrangement of material are also mentioned.
- Time allocation at pre-primary level aims at providing the students ample opportunities for an experience in every domain of development. So, each MLP is designed keeping in mind the attention span of the students and has Circle Time, Story Time, Concept Time/Pre-numeracy, which are teacher guided whereas free play is an independent activity for the students. Also, Work Time is for the students to choose an activity and the material they like. The illustrative daily routine for children of ages 3–6, detailed as per the NCF, is given in the table below.

However, any student who tries and can read or write sentences, must be appreciated and encouraged.

Methodology

Period 1: Sound of Letter M

Place: Digital Classroom/Projector Room

Sounds Book

- Organise the class in a circle using CRM signs (wait, Shh..., Stand in a Line). Tell them that they are going to listen to a story and they must pay attention. Place Sam's standee in the middle and ask the students to tell her name. Then show them the cut-outs of the moon, mat, man and mother to identify.
- Next, narrate the story on page 6 to the students with correct pronunciation and pauses using the cut-outs. Also, ask them to clap when they hear a word beginning with the sound of letter m. After the story session, divide the class into teams of two. Each team will answer few questions, such as:
 - What day is it?
 - What does Sam see in the park?
 - Name the things that begin with the m sound.

- What does Sam see at the bottom of the tree?

During the discussion, ask the students to add more words with the sound of letter m (mango, mail, monkey, muffin, money, milk, music and so on)

P.S. Encourage the students to speak in simple, short phrases or their home language.

REaMS

- Open Activity 1 of Lesson 1 on your REaMS Teacher Dashboard. Introduce the sound of letter m to the students and ask them to repeat it every time you click the letter 'm' on the screen.



You may ask the students to find the cupcake with the letter 'm' written on it. After that, let them enjoy the fun song "Mmm, you're clever!"

Note: If you want to play the song again for the students, you can find it in the 'Songs' section of the Reading Eggs Dashboard. Look for Song 1.


- Play Activity 2 of Lesson 1 for the students. Ask them to take turns and identify the objects that begin with the sound of letter m. Click on the speaker icon to let them hear the word. Then, have them repeat the words with correct pronunciation.



Sounds Book

- The students must be seated in pairs. Guide them to open the book at page 7. Then, ask them to pick a crayon of their choice and circle every M and m. Then they can check if their partner has circled the correct letter.
- Next, read and explain the statement in exercise B. Point at each object one by one and ask the students to name it and tell something about it. For example, mirror begins with the sound of letter m and is used to look at oneself.

Additional Suggested Activity

REaMS

- Open Activity 5 of Lesson 1. You may ask the students to choose the pictures that begin with the sound of letter m. Click on the speaker icon next to each picture to allow the students to hear and repeat the word.

Home Task

- Complete Lesson 1 of Reading Eggs along with worksheet 1 (Phonemic Awareness).
- Parents can help the child in doing exercises C and D on page 8. Talk to him/her about the pictures. Also, ask him/her to trace letter m with him/her index finder in exercise D before tracing it with a crayon.

Period 2: Sound of Letter S

Place: Digital Classroom/Projector Room

Sounds Book

- The students can form two teams. Show one object (soap, star, sweets and so on), beginning with the sound of letter s, to each team to identify and name it. Then, reiterate the beginning s sound and ask them to add more words that begin with the sound of letter s.



- Next, the students will get ready for the story session and are instructed to clap once they hear a word beginning with the sound of letter s in the story. Read the story with correct pronunciation and pauses. The students can be asked a few questions, such as:

- Who are walking back home?
- What do they see in the sky?
- Where are the shops?
- How many shops does Sam count?
- What does Mum buy for Sam?
- What do they wash their hands with?
- List the s sound words in the story.

P.S. The students must be encouraged to speak in short, simple phrases or their home language.

- Open Activity 1 of Lesson 2 on your REaMS Teacher Dashboard. Introduce the sound of letter s to the students and ask them to repeat it every time you click the letter s. Pause for a moment and ask the students to repeat the sound themselves.

After completing the activity, play the "Sam scares" song and let the students groove and sing along. If you want to play the song for the students, you can find it in the 'Songs' section of the Reading Eggs Dashboard. Look for Song 3.

- You may ask the students if they are ready for a game. You could say, "Now, let's see if you can find more words with the sound of letter s. Are you ready?" Play Activity 5 of Lesson 1 for the students. Ask them to take turns and identify the objects that begin with the sound of letter s. Click on the speaker icon to let them hear the word. Then, have them repeat the words with correct pronunciation.

- Form two teams of the students. They may be seated in two semi-circles using CRM signs. Ask them to open the book at page 10. Then point at the objects in exercise A for each team to identify and circle the ones that begin with the sound of letter s (sand, sunflower, socks, soap). For exercise B, guide them to trace S at the centre and then read the words given in the petals for them to repeat after you. Then, tell them to join s to each word and read the new words aloud.

- Open Lesson 2 on your REaMS Teacher Dashboard. Begin with Activity 7. Divide the class into two or three groups and ask them to match the word and the picture. Play the audio prompts to help the students.

- Parents can guide the child to complete exercises C and D on page 11. Help him/her understand and connect the objects that begin with the sound of letter s to the letter s given at the centre. Also, guide him/her to circle each S and s in exercise D.

Period 3: Sound of Letter I

Place: Digital Classroom/Projector Room

Sounds Book

- Show ice cream and ice cubes to the students to identify and notice the long vowel sound of letter i. Let them repeat the long vowel sound of letter i after you.
- The students can be asked to sit in pairs and listen attentively to the story. Instruct them to tap their head once they hear a word with long vowel sound of letter i in the story. Then read the story on page 12 for them to listen, comprehend and identify the words with long vowel sound of letter i (ice cubes). Discuss the story and ask a few questions, such as:
 - Where is Sam?
 - Who is with her?
 - What does she want to drink?
 - What does Mum need for the lemonade?
 - What does Sam see in the freezer?
 - What does Sam ask her Mum for?

P.S. The students can discuss the story and things they like to have such as, lemonade or ice cream. They may speak in simple, short sentences or their home language.

- Open Lesson 3 on your REaMS Teacher Dashboard. Start with Activity 1. Introduce the sound of letter i to the students and ask them to repeat it every time you click the letter i. Pause for a moment and ask the students to repeat the sound themselves. At the end of the activity, allow the students to enjoy the song.
- Open Activity 9 of Lesson 3. You may ask the students to say some words that have the sound of letter i. Accept all the relevant responses. After that, you may start reading the book and ask the students to repeat each word after hearing them.

- Ask the students to identify the objects and the sound they begin with (idli, igloo, insect, inkpot), that is, the short vowel sound of letter i. Then narrate the story on page 14 for them to listen and enjoy. Point out the names of places that begin with short vowel sound of letter i – India, Indore, Imphal. Ask if they have visited these places and also add more words to the list. Have a word marathon in class as they add the words to the list.

- Use CRM signs to organise the class. Help the students to form letter t with their hands placed one above the other. Then tell them sound of letter t and point at the objects like table, telephone, toy and so on. Ask them to name a few things that begin with the sound of letter t sound and add to the list.
- Help the students to open the book at page 15 and look at the picture. Then encourage them to describe the picture in their own words or home language. Then, read the story loud and clear for the students to understand and answer questions, such as:
 - Which day is it?
 - Where is Jas sitting with Ammi?
 - What does Ammi tell Jas to do?
 - Name the things Jas tells Ammi.
 - Encourage them to narrate the story in simple sentences or their home language.

- Open Activity 1 of Lesson 4 on your REaMS Teacher Dashboard. Begin by introducing the sound of letter t to the students and encourage them to repeat it each time you click letter 't'. Allow a moment for students to independently say the sound. Once the activity is complete, you may play the lively "To the Top" song for the students. Let them enjoy the music, groove along, and participate in singing. **SHOULD DO**

- Parents can help the child in doing exercises B and D on pages 16 and 17. Help him/her circle the objects that begin with the sound of letter t in exercise B. Guide him/her in writing the letter t and matching the words with pictures that begin with the sound of letter t in exercise D.

Period 2: Sound of am, at

Place: Digital Classroom/Projector Room



Sounds Book

- The students are shown flashcards with am and at followed by the pronunciations. Let them add one letter of the alphabet to sound am and sound at to see if it makes a sensible word. Have an oral drill. **COULD DO**

- Next, tell the students to get ready for the story and answer when they hear am and at words. Then, read the story with correct pronunciation and pauses. Ask a few questions to reinforce concepts, such as: **MUST DO**

- What is Jas playing with?
- Why do they open the door?
- What has Teta brought?



- What does Jas say to Teta?
- How does Teta feel on meeting Jas?


P.S. Have a class discussion on the story about saying 'thank you' when they receive something from someone. Encourage them to speak in simple, short phrases or their home language.

REaMS

- Open Activity 1 of Lesson 5 on your Teacher Dashboard. Invite the students to identify the letters a and t and pronounce their sounds. Assist them in blending the two sounds to create 'at'. Guide students in recognising and reading the rhyme 'at' both, independently and within words. Following this, play the song 'What you lookin' at?' for the students to enjoy. **SHOULD DO** 
- Play Activity 2 of Lesson 5 and you may ask the students to observe the pictures on the board and name the objects they see. Then, ask them to identify which of these words has the sound at. Play the sounds of each image to help the students identify the picture with the at sound. **MUST DO**

- The students can be guided to air trace am. Then pick a crayon of their choice and tell its colour. Then trace am in the book on page 18. **SHOULD DO** 
- Ask the students to recall am words. Then read the statement for exercise B and explain it. Then ask them to read the words in the box after you. After oral drill, they can be guided to find the words in the word search provided. Then, they can be guided to form at words and circle the words in exercise D. **MUST DO**

- The students can be guided to form word cards using old business cards. Give one card to each child to draw the picture of an object with am and at sound words. Put all the cards in one box and ask them to pick one and name it. Other students will say if the sound is am or at.

- Parents can guide the child in doing exercises C, E and F on page 19 and 20. Help him/her in completing words with am and at in exercise C and E. Also, help him/her to read the words and identify the odd one in exercise F.

Period 3: Sound of Letter B

Place: Digital Classroom/Projector Room

Sounds Book

- The students can be seated in two semi-circles facing each other. Then show them one object at a time to identify (bird, book, bell, ball, box, bee and so on). Ask them to recognise the beginning sound of each one. Confirm that the words begin with the sound of letter b. They can add to the list of words. **COULD DO** 
- Tell the students that they are going to listen to the story. They must stay alert and clap once they hear words that begin with the sound of letter b. Then read the story loud and clear for the students to comprehend and identify the words with sound of letter b used in the story. **MUST DO** 

REaMS

- Open Activity 1 on your REaMS Teacher Dashboard. Tell the students that their friend Sam is back with a new sound. You may say, "Our friend Sam is back and he has a new sound this time, sound of letter b. You know how it is said? As the letter b appears on the screen, ask them to say the letter sound.
- You may tell the students, "It's time to make our own letter book. Let's choose the picture that begins with the letter b". Open Activity 6 of Lesson 6 and show the pictures to the students and ask them if they can identify the objects. You can even play the audio for the students to hear the words and choose the correct one.

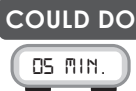

Methodology

Period 1: Sound of Letter C

Place: Digital Classroom/Projector Room

Sounds Book

- The students can be shown a candle, a cap, a cup and a cupcake to identify. Then tell them to weave a short story with those objects. Encourage them to come up with all ideas they have. Have a class storytelling session. **COULD DO** 
- They can be asked to draw any one of the objects that they have identified.
- Ask them for the common sound they all began with. Then, write the letter C on the board and tell them the sound of letter C as in cup, cake, cap and so on. Also, ask them to pay attention as they are going to listen to the story when Ryan celebrated his birthday. Place Ryan's standee at the centre and narrate the story. Let them come with their thoughts and ask questions, such as: **SHOULD DO** 
- Who is in the living room?
- What do they see on the table?
- What do the kids love?
- What does father bring for Ryan?
- What is on the cake?

Encourage the students to express their thoughts about birthday celebrations in short, simple phrases or their home language.



Additional Suggested Activity
