These disasters also lead to health problems and economic hardship for affected populations

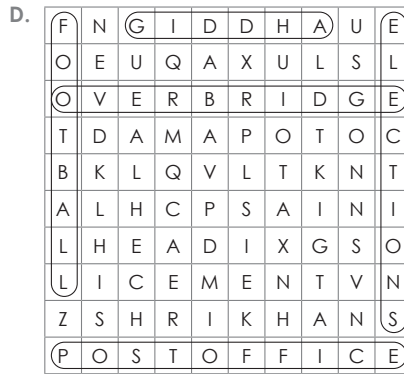
